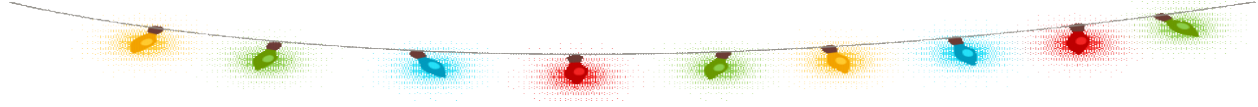

This is a follow up to let everyone know how our meeting with the County Commissioners went regarding Veteran Services in Columbia County. We had a great turn out of veterans and legion members there to support the effort to better our veteran services. I outlined the numbers, provided by the county, showing how many veterans were helped last year and how many are still waiting. We talked about the lack of benefit education for veterans and their dependents and the need for another fulltime Veteran Service Officer. We cannot expect 1 part time employee to be able to handle our large veteran community. If you are concerned about the lack of assistance here in Columbia County, I strongly urge you to call, email or visit your county commissioner and request they make our veterans more of a priority.
