And finally, the rest of the story..... We have a new member who is interested in helping homebound veterans. Below is a description of his idea:

Old Vet Net

The Old Vet Net is a new start up program designed to serve homebound veterans. At issue is a continued distressful situation with a portion of our elderly veteran homebound community. These ex-service members are too often left alone for extended periods of time.

The OVN is a radio based solution offered to veterans in need of a sustainable and reliable method of contact with other veterans and service providers. The program is structured is such a way as to allow fellow veterans in similar situations a method of communication with each other. Each qualified veteran will receive a free (to them) handheld portable radio, with antenna(s), battery chargers and an F.C.C. operational license. (NO formal testing required for the license) The transmit frequency is on an open civilian repeater located on the WCJB TV tower in Gainesville.

The repeater antenna location gives the radio an operational footprint extending from Lake City to Ocala. The radios will be programed for this frequency. The veteran will receive personalized instruction on the operation of the equipment. Testing has been successfully completed utilizing these radios and frequencies within the footprint of the repeater.

The cost to fully equip and train the veteran can be obtained via club donations; crowd sourced funding or private donations. Each set up costs approximately \$100 which covers all equipment and licensing.

The OVN is moving into the Proof of Concept phase. We're looking for several homebound vets that may be interested in participating in this program. Should you know anyone interested, please contact Rustyann Brown, at the Post, for more information.
