No other organization has that special trust. Our guns are provided by the US Army. The guns were used in WW2 and the Army converted them to specialized ceremonial rifles that fire blanks. We also HONOR living veterans by participating in ceremonies held in our community, nursing homes, hospitals and assistive living facilities. Our badge on our uniform says it all... HONOR Guard...and we are grateful to be on this very special team.
