Saturday, October 25th was indeed a very busy day beginning with our Early Bird diner in the hall while the Riders were hosting their Roadkill in the lounge which was followed by entertainment again provided by the Vintage trio band.

Friday, October 31st we hosted our annual "Kid Safe" Halloween party. For two weeks members came together to assemble the haunted house and prepare the hall for the event. Upcoming events:

November 8th: Veteran's Day Parade I know some of you will ask "Why November 8th?"

Secondly, both the VFW and the American Legion are having Veteran's Day Ceremonies at their respective posts. We have over 60 entrants to this year's parade! Our Grand Marshall is our very own CUCM Kenneth Bowen, USN, (Ret.). He was a POW in Beirut, Lebanon in 1985. He is a Nationally known speaker, a local resident, and he and his wife Vicki have been members of American Legion Post 57 for many years. We have the National Guard, ROTC, Fort White and CHS Bands, dancers, floats, decorated jeeps, horse, dogs, candy and American Flags to be handed out by the Life Trail boys troupe out of MacLenny! Many of our locally owned businesses and Law Enforcement are attending with decorated vehicles, American Legion Post 423, American Legion Post 57, the DAV, VA, FDVA, VA Police Department, Forestry Service, Dept of AG, my goodness, it's going to be an awesome parade!

December 13th: Wreaths Across America. We will start taking donations for Wreaths immediately. We will need Seven (7) Veterans from our post to place Wreaths at Olustee Park in downtown Lake City, we will also need Seven (7) American Legion Riders, to escort the Wreaths to Olustee Park. The Ceremony will take place on Saturday, December 13th, 2025 at 12:00pm.

Please volunteer to place Wreaths for the following Services:

US Army, US Marines, US Navy, US Air Force, US Coast Guard, US Space Force, and Merchant Marines, it would be nice to have a volunteer belonging to each service the wreath depicts. If you would like to volunteer, the Ceremony lasts for approximately 1 hour. We usually gather at the post to dress out the wreaths at 10:00 am, the Honor Guard transport the sound system, and all equipment needed for the ceremony, The American Legion Riders escort and the wreaths on their Motorcycles. We will need all volunteers to meet at the post no later than 1000 am to run through the ceremony, prior to the actual event. ROTC will be performing the Presentation of Colors. Post 57 Honor Guard will also be present to represent the post.

The City of Lake City also has their Christmas Festival that same Saturday, Lake City Police department no longer allows the 21 Gun Salute, to ensure the residents feel safe, in the event that people are unaware of our ceremony.

I'm kicking off this newsletter with somber news. One of our Riders, Dan Acosta, had an accident recently and is currently recovering at UF Shands, in Gainesville. Keep him in your thoughts and prayers. It's a rough end to what has otherwise been a good month for Chapter 57. Remember to keep your head on a swivel and know the other drivers out there may not see you.

Between the two raised nearly \$1000.00 for Riders Programs.

I'm looking forward to seeing more of you showing up for rides, events, fundraisers, etc. Our Ride Captain continues to put together and update a ride schedule, out to December. The schedule is somewhat flexible and updated as needed. Included in the schedule are fun rides for lunch and fellowship. If you have some place you would like to ride, bring it to the Ride Captains attention, and we will do what we can to make it happen. Most of our rides are planned for the weekends, but some of us are available during the weekdays, and ready to ride.

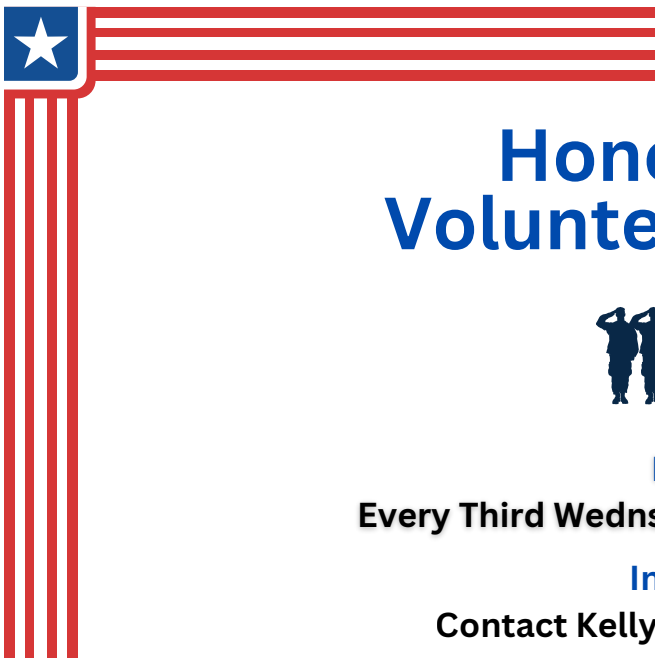

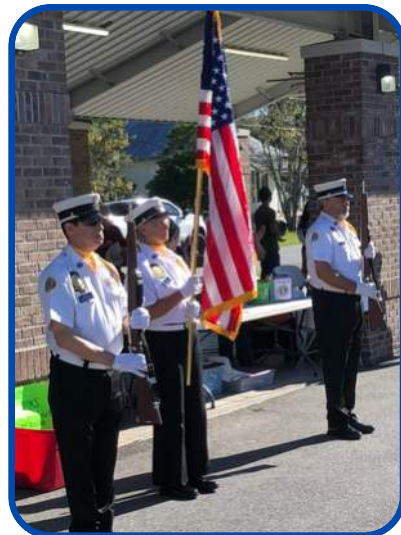

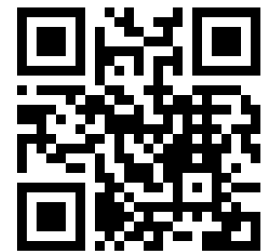


Sea Cadets

This Month's Message

November is a special month for all of us — a time to pause, reflect, and give thanks for the men and women who've worn the uniform. Veterans Day isn't just a date on the calendar — it's a reminder of the sacrifices our veterans and their families make every day. Our office continues to fight for those who fought for us. Over the past few months, we've helped secure more than \$1.2 million in new and recurring monthly VA benefits for Columbia County veterans and their families. That money goes directly into our community, improving lives and honoring promises made long ago.

Recent Case Highlights

- Four Columbia County veterans were recently awarded 100% Permanent and Total disability ratings through our office in October. Each case represents months of hard work, documentation, and persistence — and now those veterans and their families have the financial stability and healthcare access they deserve.
- Multiple increases for local veterans, including new ratings for PTSD, back conditions, and cancer-related residuals.
- Successful appeals on hypertension and sleep apnea claims tied to herbicide exposure and secondary service connections.

Community Impact

As of November 2025:

- Total Monthly Compensation Added: \$97,000+
- Annual Impact: Over \$1.16 million in new VA benefits flowing into Columbia County.
- Veterans Assisted Since January: 400+
- Approved Claims & Appeals: 200+ and counting

Every case matters, and every dollar earned goes right back into strengthening our community.

Did You Know?

- 100% Permanent & Total veterans may qualify for property tax exemptions, free license plates, and educational benefits for dependents (Chapter 35).
- Surviving spouses receiving DIC may also qualify for Aid & Attendance benefits and CHAMPVA health coverage.

Stop by the office and we'll review every benefit you're entitled to — don't leave anything on the table.

A Personal Note

This Veterans Day, take a moment to thank a veteran — but also, check on them. Sometimes, a simple “How are you doing?” means more than any ceremony. It's an honor to serve those who served. Thank you all for the trust and support you've given this office. Together, we'll keep pushing forward for every veteran in Columbia County.
