#### HONOR GUARD



Honor Guard bestowed military honors for Petty Officer First Class Robert Mears on Friday, April 22 at Forest Lawn cemetery in Lake City. Mr. Mears had a long military career in three of the five branches of service. He began serving in the Army at age 16 for four years, then entered the US Air Force for eight years and finally found his niche as an electrical engineer in the US Navy aboard the USS Independence for twenty years. Mr. Mears specifically requested a bagpiper play at his memorial service. We were able to find a piper, himself a veteran, who gladly came to honor Mr. Mears. The family was overjoyed. On Saturday, April 23, Honor Guard served along with the Gainesville Police Department Honor Guard in the service of First Lieutenant Denis Blom of Lake Butler, FL. Mr. Blom served in the US Air Force and then the Florida National Guard for nearly 20 years. He was a law enforcement officer with GPD, affectionately known as "The Dancing Cop", as he would break out into dance when directing traffic. As a friend of the family, Commander JD conducted the service in the Townsend-Green building in downtown Lake Butler.
